Implementation of Revised Gracing Marks Policy (Rev.1)

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Ref.:RNGPIT/Exam/413

This is to notify all concerned that the **Academic Council has approved the amendment** in the existing *Gracing Marks Policy* vide Notification dated **03-12-2024**. As per the approval, the revised provision regarding the applicability of grace marks shall be implemented as follows:

Revised Provision (Rev.1): Gracing marks shall be applied during:

- Initial result preparation, and
- **After Reassessment**, if the student becomes eligible as per prescribed norms.

Key Points:

- Grace marks may now be awarded after reassessment results, subject to eligibility.
- The **maximum limit of grace marks and number of subjects** remain unchanged.
- **All other clauses shall remain the same as per the Notification dated 03-12-2024.**

Effective Date:

- This revised policy (Rev.1) shall be **implemented from Academic Year 2025–26 onwards**.
- All Heads of Departments, faculty members, and examination staff are hereby instructed to take note of the above and ensure proper implementation.

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Gracing Marks Policy

Ref.:RNGPIT/Exam/1859-1

General Applicability Scope:

The Gracing Marks Policy applies to all students enrolled in UG and PG programs at R.N.G. Patel Institute of Technology. The purpose is to extend limited academic relief to students falling marginally short of passing marks while ensuring academic standards are maintained.

Scheme for Grace Marks:

- Grace marks will apply only to the Semester-End Examination Theory (SEE TH).
- Grace marks will not be applied to the Semester-End Examination Practical (SEE P), Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) component, which includes CCE and IAT.
- The grace marks under these rules will not be counted for the award of scholarships, prizes, medals, or any other awards.
- The institute reserves the right to withhold or nullify any merit or award if, in the opinion of a duly constituted Disciplinary Committee, such action is deemed necessary.

Grace Marks for Failing in Subjects:

- A student can receive grace marks in a maximum of 2 subjects per semester.
- The maximum grace marks provided in a subject shall be up to 10% of the weightage of the SEE TH component for that course.
- A student can receive a maximum of grace marks equivalent to 10% weightage in each of the 2 subjects per semester examination.
- Gracing will be applied during the initial evaluation result preparation only.
- No gracing will be provided during Reassessment or after Reassessment results.
- Gracing shall be applied only if the student has appeared in all subjects required to clear the respective semester either in a regular or remedial examination, where the gracing is to be applicable.

Exclusions:


- Grace Marks will not be allotted for passing in the following components:
- Semester-End Examination Practical (SEE P), Continuous Internal Evaluation (CCE and IAT), Group Research Project, Research Project, Summer Internship, Final Semester Internship, Dissertation Phase.


Important Notes:

- Grace marks are a privilege extended to students; they are not a right.
- Gracing is intended to assist students who are marginally short of passing marks, while ensuring academic integrity and standards.
- The final decision regarding the application or interpretation of this policy shall rest with the designated competent authority.

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
